ANTaR is a national organisation that works in partnership and solidarity with Indigenous peoples towards creating a just society that respects Indigenous peoples' rights and cultures.

ANTaR began in 1997 as an initiative in response to Federal Government moves to wind back Indigenous native title rights. It has grown into a peoples' movement that has an integral place in the Reconciliation movement in Australia.

Mission

ANTaR's mission is to generate in Australia a moral and legal recognition of and respect for the distinctive status of Indigenous Australians as First Peoples and for the protection of Indigenous Australians' rights, including their relationship to land, the right to self-determination and the maintenance and growth of their unique cultures.

Vision

An Australian society that respects and values Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples' cultures and heritage, and provides justice and equity for all.

Goals

ANTaR's work focuses on education, awareness-raising and advocacy targeting non-Indigenous Australians, and projects targeted at improving the health and rights of Indigenous Australians.

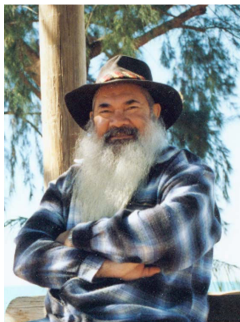
Legal Standing

ANTaR is a non-profit incorporated association. It is independent of political, corporate and government interests. Much of ANTaR's work is carried out by volunteers. ANTaR is funded by donations from individual supporters.

ANTaR is audited by leading auditors, KPMG. In the event that ANTaR should cease to exist, its assets will be distributed to an appropriate organisation with similar objects to ANTaR.

Members of ANTaR's national body include a number of peak national non-government organisations including Oxfam Australia, the Australian Council of Social Services (ACOSS), Amnesty International, the Australian Council for Overseas Aid (ACFOA) and the Australian Council of Trade Unions (ACTU).

ANTaR's work has strong Indigenous support. Our Indigenous Reference Group, which provides advice and direction on ANTaR's activities, includes prominent Indigenous leaders and individuals such as Patrick Dodson, Professor Lowitja O'Donoghue, Professor Mick Dodson, Senator Aden Ridgeway, Professor Marcia Langton, Dr Bill Jonas and many others.

How to leave a bequest to ANTaR

It is important to be clear and concise in the wording of your will. If you wish to leave a gift to ANTaR in your Will, your solicitor can use the following wording to write a new will or to add a codicil to your existing will:

“I (first name, middle name, last name), give to Australians for Native Title and Reconciliation (ANTaR) for its (general purposes) or (its _____ purposes) the following:

- the sum of \$_____ (cash);
- and/or _____ % of my Estate;
- and/or the residue of my Estate;
- and/or ‘description of personal property such as land, a building, shares, artworks or other personal property’

free of all taxes and duties, and for which the written acknowledgement of the National Treasurer or other proper person shall be sufficient discharge.”

Use of your bequest

By including ANTaR in your will you will be investing in a more secure and just future for Indigenous Australians.

Leaving a bequest to ANTaR will enable us to realise ANTaR’s long term vision. Use of your bequest monies will symbolise your concern for the rights of Indigenous Australians and for their future.
